PROJECT DESCRIPTION

BPS served as a subconsultant for the development of an Americans with Disability Act (ADA) Transition Plan for the City of Gahanna. This project included multiple phases including reviewing facilities, programs, activities, and other related city services for ADA accessibility.

The project's primary objective was to develop a comprehensive ADA Transition Plan for the City of Gahanna, ensuring that all public facilities, programs, activities, and services met the current accessibility standards mandated by the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). This encompassed a thorough review and assessment of existing infrastructure and services to identify areas that required improvement or modification to comply with ADA guidelines.

BPS performed a self-evaluation—or review—of over 2,100 curb ramps within the public rights-of-way. This involved meticulously surveying and documenting sidewalks, APS signalized intersections, crosswalks, ramps, and other elements. BPS also reviewed field data collected and the analyses of suspect curb ramps through quality assurance/control of data. The data collected during this phase served as a critical foundation for the subsequent stages of the project, offering insights into the current state of accessibility within the city. The field data collection process employed by BPS included on-site inspections, measurements, and the use of advanced surveying technologies to ensure accuracy.
